Meet „ JASON DUFF „

In the spotlight this quarter is a young man from Elkton, Florida who competed on the NFJGTOUR, Florida Junior Tour, American Golf Association, played collegiate ball at the University of North Florida graduating with a degree in Sports Management, turning pro in 2025 and is an affiliate of the North Florida PGA and now works at San Jose Country Club under the tutelage of PGA Professional and "Hall of Famer" Todd Bork with aspirations of competing on the BIG STAGE.



NORTH FLORIDA

In the spotlight this quarter is a young man from Elkton, Florida who competed on the NFJGTOUR, Florida Junior Tour, American Golf Association, played collegiate ball at the University of North Florida graduating with a major in Sports Management, turning pro in 2025 and is now an affiliate of the North Florida PGA and now works at San Jose Country Club under the tutelage of PGA Professional Todd Bork with aspirations of competing on the BIG STAGE.

Jason played on the NFJGTOUR for five years from 2014-2018 competing in 30 events winning five times with 6 runner ups and 17 top 10's while also competing on the Florida Junior Tour (FJT) and American Junior Golf Association (AJGA). Jason's low round of 68 was shot in the Titleist Invitational at St. Johns Golf Club where he was the runner-up twice losing a sudden death playoff in both events. Jason won the North Florida Junior Amateur at World Golf Village Slammer & Squire posting rounds of 71-77 and the San Jose Classic where he shot 73.

In 2019 after his run on the NFJGTOUR Jason would move on to specifically play on the Florida Junior Tour (FJT) and the American Junior Golf Association (AJGA) winning multiple times. Jason was a Two-time champion on the FJT (2016, 2020) and twice runner-up on AJGA while collecting several Top 5 showings in AJGA events.

In High School

Jason was a Varsity letterwinner in golf at Pedro Menendez High claiming the 2A Individual State Championship (2019) and named to the First Coast All-Decade team. Jason was a four-time All-Conference and All-County honoree, a *Florida Times-Union* Golfer of the Year (2019), the only prep golfer in decade to sweep medalist at District, Regional and State Championships. He was also the four-year Falcon Award winner at Menendez and the first and only first-year golfer to qualify for State Championship as a freshman.

Jason played college ball at the University of North Florida from 2021-2025 and was a key player for the winning Osprey's Men's Golf Team improving his playing status each year as he climbed the collegiate ranks.

During 2021-22

Jason was the 2022 ASUN Champion, the ASUN Freshman of the Year and was on the ASUN All-Freshmen Team. He played in eight events with a scoring average of 74.82 per tournament. Jason made his collegiate debut at Rod Myers Invitational with score of 3-over 219.

- Shot two rounds under par with best 18-hole score at 1-under 69 in third round of Sea Best Invitational.
- Best 54-hole score was 5-over 215 (74-72-69) at Sea Best Invitational
- Best finish was tied for 12th at Nexus Championship in Bahamas with score of 17-over 233.
- Awarded ASUN Freshman of the Year and ASUN All-Freshman honors.
- Helped UNF to six top-three finishes, including team titles at The Hayt and ASUN Championship.

2022-23

- Played in five events, one as a member of the team, with a scoring average of 73.93 per round.
- Shot two total rounds under par as an unattached individual at both The Hayt and Mason Rudolph Championship.
- Set new career-best 18-hole score at 4-under 68 in the final round of The Vanderbilt in his last round of the season.
- His best 54-hole score of the season was at the Schenkel Championship at 6-over 222 in only event as a part of the team score.
- All three competitive rounds played counted towards the team's score at the Georgia Southern meet.

2023-24

- Competed in 12 tournaments and recorded a scoring average of 73.31.
- Set career-best 18-hole score with 4-under 67 in the second round of the Kaanapali Classic Collegiate.
- Also surpassed career-best 54-hole score with 9-under 207 at the Puerto Rico Classic.
- Placed inside the top 25 in four events: finished 16th in Puerto Rico Classic, 17th in General Hackler Championship and ASUN Championship, and 21st at Sea Best Invitational.
- Was also 26th at Quail Valley Collegiate and 30th at Kaanapali Classic Collegiate
- Completed nine rounds under par, four rounds in the 60s and three tournaments under par.
- Helped Ospreys to four top-three placements and eight top-five finishes.
- Aided UNF to a fifth-place team finish at the NCAA Rancho Santa Fe Regional to advance to its eighth national championship appearance in program history.
- Also included team runner-up finishes at Sea Best Invitational and Gator Invitational.
- Was top-three UNF scorers in eight events, including lead scorer at General Hackler. Championship, and had 27 rounds count towards the team score.

2024-25

- Played in all 11 events this year with a scoring average of 72.34 per round.
- Led the team in tournaments under par with four total in 11 events played.
- Carded eight rounds under par in 32 rounds played.
- Earned a team-high four top-25 finishes with a top-10 finish as the runner-up at the World Golf Village Collegiate scoring 1-under 143 (70-73).
- Also placed 13th overall at the ASUN Championship scoring 4-under 212 (72-68-72).
- Lowest round of the season was 5-under 67 (3rd Rd, Puerto Rico Classic).
- Placed as the top Osprey in five of eleven events, including seven finishes in the top-two for the team.
- Led the team with 30-for-32 (93.8%) of competitive rounds that were counted towards the team score.

- Helped the Ospreys to a team winning tournament at the World Golf Village Collegiate in Saint Augustine.
